



## **Inappropriate Technology Use by Students Discipline Guidelines**

*One of our missions with the Mobile Learning Initiative is to proactively educate children in the appropriate use of technology in the 21st Century, rather than repeated negative consequences such as revoking iPad privileges for less harsh situations.*

### **Examples of Possible Inappropriate Choices with Technology:**

- Taking pictures or videos of students and staff without permission
- Misuse of Social Media or the camera
- Downloading of content that is not age appropriate
- Repeated damage or lost/stolen devices
- Off Task with non-educational use of technology during instructional time

**Possible discipline consequences may vary depending on law enforcement investigations as they relate to origination of content.**

**Possible consequences could include, but are not limited to:**

1. Create a Public Service Announcement in Keynote/iMovie about appropriate Digital Citizenship
2. Complete courses on appropriate digital citizenship using CVUSD Digital Citizenship iTunes U Courses and Common Sense Media
3. Add student to AirWatch Discipline Smart Group
4. Lunch Detention

5. Afterschool Detention
6. Campus Beautification (pending parent permission)
7. Reflective Essay
8. Loss of iPad Privileges(1week,2weeks,1month)
9. Loss of iPad Take Home Privileges(1week,2weeks,1month)
10. Suspension
11. In addition to the above mentioned consequences, also follow any PBIS aligned strategies for appropriate student behavior
