



Teacher Guidelines for Student Discipline

One of our missions with the Mobile Learning Initiative is to proactively educate children in the appropriate use of technology in the 21st Century, rather than repeated negative consequences such as revoking iPad privileges for less harsh situations.

Examples of Possible Inappropriate Choices with Technology:

- Taking pictures or videos of students and staff without permission
- Misuse of Social Media or the camera (Cyber Bullying)
- Downloading of content that is not age appropriate
- Repeated damage or lost/stolen devices
- Off task with non-educational use of technology during instructional time
- Plagiarism of online materials
- Cheating on assessments
- Inappropriate use of Airdrop

Possible discipline consequences may vary depending on law enforcement investigations as they relate to origination of content.

Possible consequences could include, but are not limited to:

1. Assign student(s) to create a Public Service Announcement using Keynote/iMovie about appropriate Digital Citizenship
2. Assign student(s) to complete courses on appropriate digital citizenship using CVUSD Digital Citizenship iTunes U Courses and Common Sense Media
3. Assign student(s) to add student to AirWatch Discipline Smart Group through site administration, who have been trained in these procedures

4. Assign student(s) to lunch or afterschool detention
5. Assign student(s) to participate in Campus Beautification (pending parent permission)
6. Assign student(s) to write a reflective essay on how their actions negatively impacted their Digital Footprint or another student
7. Loss of iPad Privileges or take home option, after seeking administrative approval and parent is contacted (1wk, 2wks, 1month)
8. Conduct a conference with the parent or call home
9. Suspension following site discipline procedures
10. In addition to the above mentioned consequences, you could also follow any PBIS aligned strategies for appropriate student behavior
